+ November 2025 - \$400






# INDUSTRY NETWORKING NIGHT






# DIVERSITY DAY

→ March 2026 - \$600

This is a large event that takes place on International Women's Day each year. It is an event that can provide education on various aspects of diversity, including accessibility, race, gender, sexuality, and more. This event may include panel discussions and professionals in STEM regarding diversity initiatives throughout the day, possibly in addition to presentations of marginalized groups. The format of the event is flexible and can take many forms as long as it highlights the core values of diversity and inclusivity. It can for example include interactive games and challenges that encourage participants to actively engage with one another and build a sense of community. The goal is to create an environment where students can learn, connect, and celebrate the diverse identities that exist within our campus.



# WOMEN IN SPACE

+ March 2026 - \$500

This event will feature a panel discussion on career opportunities in the space industry and the significance of diversity in the field. The panel will include industry professionals, academics in the aerospace and space sectors, and female members from campus teams like SOAR, CTS, and SSRT, who will share their insights and experiences. Following the panel, a networking session will provide attendees the opportunity to engage with professionals and potentially explore team booths to learn more about space-related initiatives. The event is open to undergraduate students and high schoolers interested in pursuing careers in the space industry.

## KALEIDOSCOPE CONFERENCE

Winter 2026 - \$15,000

Considering the great success of our annual Diversity Days in the last decade, for the first time ever this year, WISE is excited to organize a two-day diversity conference - the Kaleidoscope Conference - focused on bringing together the larger UCalgary community to celebrate all the diversity we have to offer.

This event will bring together student organizations and clubs celebrating and supporting underrepresented and marginalized communities - from race, to sexuality, to gender - on campus for a two-day weekend conference at the end of the school year. Here, we hope to bolster personal, academic and professional development by hosting a career fair with sponsors and professionals, informative industry panels, workshops, and group activities that spotlight biases in the workplace and promote conversations on important equity topics.

A unique space that brings together diverse communities from all corners of the University of Calgary is something that does not currently exist, and we are striving to fill that void. With an event like this, we continue to promote our mission of promoting equity, diversity and inclusion for all, while providing opportunities for students and sponsors alike to form relationships with like-minded individuals who are also striving to create more inclusive classrooms and workplaces.

# EARTH SCIENCE FOR SOCIETY

+ March 2026 - \$150

This multiple day event focuses on raising awareness about Women in STEM through engaging, hands-on science activities. It provides young students with the opportunity to explore key scientific concepts while fostering important lessons in diversity and inclusion. Last year, we welcomed over 200 students and introduced them to a fun, interactive experiment using homemade oobleck: a creative way to learn about non-Newtonian fluids. Contributions to this event help us continue delivering impactful, hands-on science experiences that inspire and empower the next generation of young scientists.

# BUILDING BRIDGES: MENTORSHIP PROGRAM

+ 2025 - 2026 - \$400

The "Building Bridges" mentorship program was established to foster collaboration among women in STEM by connecting female undergraduate STEM students with mentors working in the STEM field. The 2025/2026 program includes three key events that help build and strengthen these connections. It kicks off in October 2025 with the Mentorship Kick-Off, where mentor and mentee pairs meet for the first time in person over casual "get to know you" games designed to break the ice. In January 2026, pairs reunite for a fun and relaxed Mid-Year Check-In Trivia Night, offering a chance to catch up mid-program. Finally, the Mentorship Wrap-Up in April 2026 provides space to reflect on the year's experiences and celebrate the relationships formed. Corporate sponsors are invited to send representatives to participate as mentors.

#### WISE X PASS: STUDY SESSIONS

+

November 2025, March 2026 - \$500

This event is designed to support students in preparing for upcoming exams through a collaborative review session led by Peer Assisted Study Session (PASS) leaders. Students are given the opportunity to strengthen their understanding of key concepts through practice worksheets, participating in games related to exam content, and by asking PASS leaders questions for more clarification. By working together, students are able to engage in exam practice in a supportive environment.

#### VOLUNTEERING PROGRAM



Budget of \$200




## KIDS IN STEM

Kids in STEM is aimed at children aged 8-12 to get them hands-on experience with science through various science experiments, from chromatography, to bridge building, speed math and more. This initiative is in collaboration with the Calgary Public Library.





### **PDW**

+ Budget of \$1,000


The events our Professional Development Workshop team hosts are designed to equip participants with essential skills for professional success, focusing on both planned presentations and impromptu speaking. The goal is to help individuals refine their ability to confidently speak and present themselves, whether at career fairs, networking events, or in everyday professional interactions. Through mastering techniques such as crafting an engaging elevator pitch, structuring clear and compelling presentations, and practicing impromptu responses using methods like the PREP technique, attendees will learn how to effectively "sell" themselves while remaining personable and engaging. The events also emphasize the importance of personal branding, offering practical advice on using tools like LinkedIn and portfolios to stand out. Additionally, participants will gain insights into how to network strategically, meet industry professionals, and seize opportunities to get their foot in the door in their desired industry. With hands-on practice and real-time feedback, these events provide participants with the tools to navigate public speaking challenges, boost confidence, and build lasting connections.

#### LUNCH & LEARN AND OTHER SCHOOL ACTIVITIES

#### + Budget of \$100

Lunch and Learns are interactive sessions designed to support high school students as they prepare for the transition to post-secondary education. These events offer valuable insight into university life, with a focus on STEM-related degrees and research opportunities. Through engaging presentations and open discussions, students receive practical tips and advice on everything from choosing a program and managing academic workloads, to navigating campus resources and building a well-rounded student experience. In addition to academic guidance, Lunch and Learns also highlight the importance of life outside the classroom, including student clubs, networking opportunities, and maintaining a healthy school-life balance, helping students feel more confident and prepared for the journey ahead.





#### **GIRL GUIDES WINTER FEST**

+ Budget of \$400

The Girl-Guides Winter Fest is a program taking place in late January and will host over 200 girls across Calgary's Girl Guides program in Grades 9-11. The Guide-aged girls will participate in winter-themed experiments designed to introduce them to the world of science through fun, hands-on activities. Last year's Fall-themed science fest for the Girl Guides featured six experiments and welcomed 400 students across various sessions.

# WISE RESEARCH AWARD

+ Budget of \$8,000

WISE provides funding to offer eight female and gender-diverse students in Grades 11 or 12 the opportunity to participate in a summer research program at the University of Calgary. Through this initiative, students are paired with a research supervisor in a STEM field of their choice, allowing them to gain meaningful, hands-on experience in a university research environment. Over the summer, participants develop valuable technical and analytical skills, explore real-world applications of scientific concepts, and begin building a network of academic and professional mentors. This program is designed to inspire early interest in STEM, foster confidence in research settings, and help students envision a future in science or engineering.
